

## **Asset Self-Certification**

For households whose combined net assets do not exceed the current HUD asset threshold amount, or do not exceed after deducting the most recent Federal, not State or City, tax return received in the last 12 months from the total value of net family assets.

Complete only <u>one</u> form per family. Include assets of children except foster children. Also exclude assets held by foster adults or live-in aides.

**NOTE #1-IMPORTANT STEP:** Owners/management agents do not need to third-party verify the amount of the Federal tax refund/ refundable tax credits if the family's net assets are at/below the current HUD asset threshold. However, if the family's net assets are over the current threshold amount, owners/management agents must third-party verify the amount of the Federal tax refund/ credit received in the last 12 months and subtract it from the total net family assets. The income tax return/credit can bring the applicant/ tenant's total net family assets below the HUD threshold amount and therefore allow the use of this form.

**NOTE #2:** To determine net family assets: ADD the value of NNPP {\$0 (if below the threshold amount) or the actual amount}, ADD value of Real Property, DEDUCT Federal tax refund/credit.

PENALTIES FOR MISUSING THIS CONTENT: Title 18, Section 1001 of the U.S. Code states that a person is guilty of a felony for knowingly and willingly making false or fraudulent statements to any department of the United States Government. HUD and any owner (or any employee of HUD or the owner) may be subject to penalties for unauthorized disclosures or improper uses of information collected based on the consent form. Any person who knowingly or willingly requests, obtains, or discloses any information under false pretenses concerning an applicant or participant may be subject to a misdemeanor and fined not more than \$5,000. Penalty provisions for misusing the social security number are contained in the Social Security Act at 208 (a) (6), (7), and (8). Violations of these provisions are cited as violations of 42 USC 408 (a), (6), (7), and (8).
